## Christian Village Hospice

Christian Village Hospice was established to provide comfort care and enhance the quality of life for individuals residing at The Christian Village at Mason and The Christian Village at Mt. Healthy. Christian Village Hospice received licensure from the Ohio Department of Health in March 2023 and certification and accreditation for Medicare from Community Health Accreditation Partners (CHAP) September 2023.

Hospice care is a compassionate approach that prioritizes the comfort and well-being of individuals with advanced illnesses and their families. Hospice care is an option for patients who have made the choice to shift their focus from seeking a cure for their condition to prioritizing comfort, symptom relief, and an improved quality of life. Our focus is on comfort and quality of life for our residents with life-limiting illnesses and to provide Christian, comprehensive care to the terminally ill and support for their families and caregivers.

Christian Village Hospice enrolled the first patient in April 2023 and have since served 19 patients. Our experienced hospice care team provides support for both the patient and their families by creating a personalized plan that addresses your physical, emotional, and spiritual needs.

The Christian Village Hospice team consists of a Clinical Director/ Case Manager, an RN, Social Worker, Chaplain, State Tested Nurse Aide and Volunteers, as well as a Medical Director. Patients can continue to have their own primary physician manage their care. Each team member visits patients routinely to provide individualized medical, emotional, and spiritual needs for our patients. This plan of care is integrated with the care plan and care that each patient receives in our facilities. Christian Village Hospice team members collaborate with The Christian Village at Mason and The Christian Village at Mt. Healthy teams.

We have been blessed to provide orientation for several volunteers. These individuals provide extra support for our patients. Volunteers often help patients read, write letters, visit with pets, provide music, and many other services. The relationship our patients develop with the volunteers is incredible.

Heart Felt Care is a one-on-one 24/7 bedside presence during the last hours of life to provide additional support to the patient, their family, and facility staff. It is important to our team and to our mission to provide additional nursing oversight, as well as emotional and spiritual support during this journey.

We are proud to provide these services for our residents and their families. Our mission is to maintain comfort

and dignity while offering support to the patient through our continuum of care from admission throughout the duration of their illness. Hospice fulfills that mission.

## Chaplain's Corner

### "Thank You!"

Growing up, I loved to watch the long-running series, "The Little Rascals." Maybe you did, too. Characters like Alfalfa, Spanky, Froggie, Stymie, and all the rest were endearing characters who became a vivid part of my childhood imagination. I laughed at their hijinks and marveled at the limitless ingenuity that allowed them to create awesome things out of worthless odds-and-ends scrounged from dusty attics and local junkyards.

But far more than just building such contraptions, "Our Gang" stories were centered upon building relationships that often included a dandy clubhouse held together with a few rusty nails and a whole lot of luck. There were secret handshakes and special "hi signs," too. And, at the clubhouse door, members always needed to know a special "password" to be allowed in.

I know the church is not a club. But if, some Sunday, someone were to stop you at the door and ask—"What's the password?"—what might you say? What special word should be on your lips (and in your heart) as you want to come into worship?

There is a psalm—often called "The Old 100th" because of its numbered place in the Hebrew song book—which says: "Enter his gates with thanksgiving." It is an invitation—even a command—about how to enter worship. And I like the way these words are captured through a contemporary translation: "Enter with the password: 'Thank you!"

There may be no better way to gain entry into God's presence than with an expression of gratitude. The psalm says:

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise;

give thanks to him and praise his name.

For the Lord is good and his love endures forever;

His faithfulness continues through all generations

You should be receiving your Annual Notice of Change that will explain changes to your Medicare Plan for 2024. You may also receive numerous fliers and phone calls about signing new forms or enrollment in new plans. **Please be cautious.** Most plans review automatically, and you do not need to sign anything.
